## At the Fox, state's Vietnam vets are paid tribute at debut of film



It felt like an emotional homecoming at the Fox Theatre on Friday night before the debut of "Our Vietnam Generation," director Keith Famie's documentary tribute to Michiganders who served in the war.

With a crowd of thousands expected for the screening and related events, the Fox's lobby was packed with veterans and supporters sharing handshakes, tears and hugs.

For many, this was a night that felt long overdue, given the conflicted feelings that embroiled the nation during the Vietnam era.
